

Who Is the Holy Spirit? Devotions

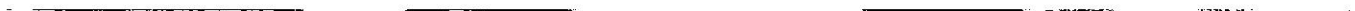
We hope you'll choose to do these devotions too. Each one is designed for you to respond to a Scripture passage in the following ways:

Scripture. Begin with the Scripture passage, and read it through one or more times. Write down or underline anything that stands out to you as you read.

Observation. Next write down what you observed about what you read. You might write only a sentence or two or fill pages in a journal.

Application. Look back at what you observed about the Scripture and write down how your life will be different because of what you've read. Make notes to help you remember what the Holy Spirit is revealing to you.

Prayer. End by writing a prayer to God, inviting Him to help you apply what you are discovering to your life. Enjoy these devotions on your own or with family and friends! Share what you are learning with others to encourage them to grow in their relationship with the Holy Spirit too.



1 Who Is the Holy Spirit? Devotion

John 14:25–29

S Scripture. *What stands out to you as you read this passage?*

Jesus gives final teachings to His disciples before He is crucified, raised from the dead, and ascends to heaven. Among these teachings, He comforts the disciples with the promise of the Holy Spirit while they wait for His return.

“All this I have spoken while still with you. But the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you all things and will remind you of everything I have said to you. Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid.

“You heard me say, ‘I am going away and I am coming back to you.’ If you loved me, you would be glad that I am going to the Father, for the Father is greater than I. I have told you now before it happens, so that when it does happen you will believe.”

O Observation. *What did you observe about what you read?*

A Application. *How should your life be different because of what you read?*

P Prayer. *Write a prayer inviting God to help you apply what you are learning.*
